Bystander Intervention Training for Sexual Misconduct Prevention



Center for Violence Prevention at the University of Northern Iowa. Thirty-six ISU and ACCESS staff have been trained as trainers for the **Mentors in Violence Prevention (MVP)** bystander intervention program over the past 5 years, and twelve remain active as trainers. During spring 2011 through fall 2014, we have facilitated 136 groups, for a total of **6,293 students**.

The MVP program was co-founded by **Jackson Katz**, a national leader in sexual violence prevention. *Bystander intervention training does not view men and women as potential perpetrators or victims, but all people as potential bystanders who can be empowered to intervene and prevent sexual misconduct.* The training provides concrete tools for confronting, interrupting and preventing this violence, because the more options a person has available to them, the more likely they are to intervene. Understanding these stages can help individuals notice when they are "in" one of them and motivate them to take action to move into the next stage.

Prevention Services staff collaborated with hall directors and ACCESS staff to provide bystander intervention training for 200 CA's during staff training in August and January.

Bystander intervention training is recommended by the **White House Not Alone Report** and required by the **Campus Save Act**. Train-the-trainer workshops were provided through the **Violence Against Women Act (VAWA)** Grant for Iowa Regents Institutions starting in Spring of 2010, and continue to be available through the
