
Administration



The **Student Health radiology department** plays an important role in the care of students on campus. Their role is to assist the clinicians in diagnosing and treating injury and disease. This fiscal year, the radiology technicians performed **more than 1900 x-ray exams**. "This is the highest number of total exams performed for more than 5 years," said **diagnostic services supervisor, Rita Stumpf**.

Stumpf attributes the volume not only to increased enrollment, but also to the January 2012 conversion the department made to **state-of-the-art digital x-ray equipment**. The use of this



digital equipment, combined with a close co-operation with **McFarland Clinic** radiologists, has allowed Student Health's patients to have images taken here on campus, read by the radiologists and reports returned all within a few hours. The department also works closely with **McFarland Orthopedics** when they evaluate patients at the Student Health.

The department staff include **Lana Ragaller**(FT), **Lynn Koenig** (PT), **Sara Kaltenheuser** (PRN), **Amanda Alexander** (PRN) and **Dan Storck** (PRN) who can take a full range of exams including head, chest, spine, abdomen/pelvis, upper and lower extremities.

Dan Storck also assists the department with their quality program development and monitoring. All technicians participate in regular chart audits.

Images taken at Student Health are used for patient care here on campus, but can also be easily shared if the student needs referral to a specialist or hometown provider.
