## specializing in **students:** *Pharmacy*

**Student Health's pharmacy is right inside the main entrance of Student Health. It's one of the first things students see when they walk in the door. It's also one of the first encounters with the services at Student Health that many Iowa State students have.**

In addition to filling over 40,000 prescriptions for students every year, the pharmacy also has expanded the role of providing walk-in flu vaccinations for students. Although Student Health advertises walk-in flu vaccinations on Wednesdays and Saturdays, it's not uncommon for the pharmacy staff to handle a walk-in request on any given day of the week.

With the help of many Drake pharmacy students who are doing a rotation at Student Health, the pharmacy has administered over 1,081\* flu vaccinations this semester.

In addition to giving students flu vaccines, the pharmacy staff are available to offer many treatment options for students' ills or referrals to the proper resource.

Student Health's pharmacy offers a convenient location, dependable service, and competitive prices for students.

Three full-time pharmacists and a full support staff fill prescriptions, assist in over-the-counter product selection and provide information about medications.

Students not only have access to the pharmacy staff to ask questions about their medications, but they also have privacy when picking up prescriptions. A private consultation room is available for confidential conversations.
